

# Dual Enrollment at Los Angeles Valley College



Dual enrollment provides opportunities for high school students to take college courses and earn college credit.



Dual enrollment courses are held at partnering high schools during the regular school day or afterschool.



Dual enrollment courses are taught by college instructors and have the same rigor and learning outcomes as classes taught at the college.



No cost.




Students can enroll up to 11-units (Non-CCAP) and 15-units (CCAP)





# Differences Between Dual Enrollment, and Advanced Placement

## How can college credit be used?

Fulfill high school graduation requirements

Applied to the completion of credentials at LAVC or other colleges within the Los Angeles Community College District.

Transfer to universities within the California State (CSU) and University of California(UC) systems.

Transfer to colleges and universities outside of the State of California.

# Helpful Tips for Parents

01

Encourage your child to take the lead when communicating with instructors regarding questions and concerns.

Encourage your child to utilize campus resources

03

Work with your child to ensure they understand their syllabus and course expectations, policies, etc.



# Steps to transferring college credit.

## Review the credit transfer policy/process at prospective institutions.

- **Advisory** - Institutions outside of California may limit the number of credits students can transfer into their institution. In addition, some may need additional information about the course (i.e., course description, syllabus) to determine whether it's equivalent to their course.



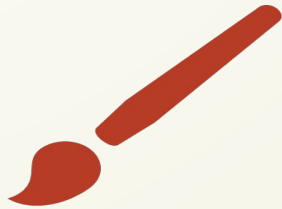
## Request an official LAVC transcript through Parchment.

- **Advisory** – Although LAVC courses may be listed on a student's high school transcript. Colleges and universities will still require official transcripts from LAVC to verify final grades and credit earned.



Follow-up with prospective institution to determine whether the course(s) transferred.

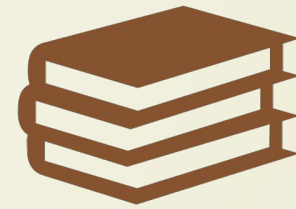
